## FINANCIAL UPDATE

Pledges budgeted	\$32,500	\$97,500	\$35,167
Pledges received	\$24,930	\$92,433	\$11,487
Difference	-\$ 7,570	-\$ 5,067	-\$23,680

Pledges for the month of March were surprisingly down by -\$7,570, but we are ahead of last year's numbers by \$13,443. YTD we are down -\$5,067 from budget, but still ahead of last year by \$11,612. Also, our YTD non-pledged dollars are still ahead of budget by \$70 and ahead of 2022 YTD by \$1,423.

Our total income for March was down -\$5,086 from budget, but ahead of last year by \$16,206. Total income against budget YTD is down -\$4,820, but ahead of last year by \$14,654. And again, the total income does not reflect any Listos rent dollars. We show a nice income from interest earned from our bank accounts and increases in the use of building to outside groups is continuing to grow.

Overall expense control continues to be handled very well. We were over budgeted expenses for the month by \$953, but YTD we are \$15,937 under budget. Month to date, our expenses werr down \$11,000 from 2022 March and \$29,450 down from last YTD.

We're still going. Hopefully March was a fluke and we can get back on track for the month of April!
