Beginning on September 26, gathering will be on Tuesday at 6:30p and will last 75 minutes.



The story of the Afro-Christian Convention, one story of many in the history of the independent Black Church, is the story of faith, survival, affirmation, and empowerment in the hostile environment of racism. From 1892 to the 1960s, the Afro-Christian Convention was composed of 150 churches and 25,000 members, located primarily in North Carolina and Virginia. The tradition of the Afro-Christian church, too long ignored and under-celebrated, takes its rightful place in the canon of United Church of Christ history.



"Afro-Christian Convention: The Fifth Stream of the United Church of Christ is a must-read story of the recovery and restoration of the Afro-Christian Convention to its rightful place alongside the denominations that formed the United Church of Christ. The book traces the emergence of independent Black churches in America from the invisible to the visible - from hush harbors and white church balconies - to conferences and conventions, including the Afro-Christian Convention (1866-1950). Its story is recounted from oral histories, sermons, conference minutes, newspaper publications, personal papers, and archival records in such details that I felt as if I was one among the daughters and sons baptized and nurtured in the Afro-Christian church.
